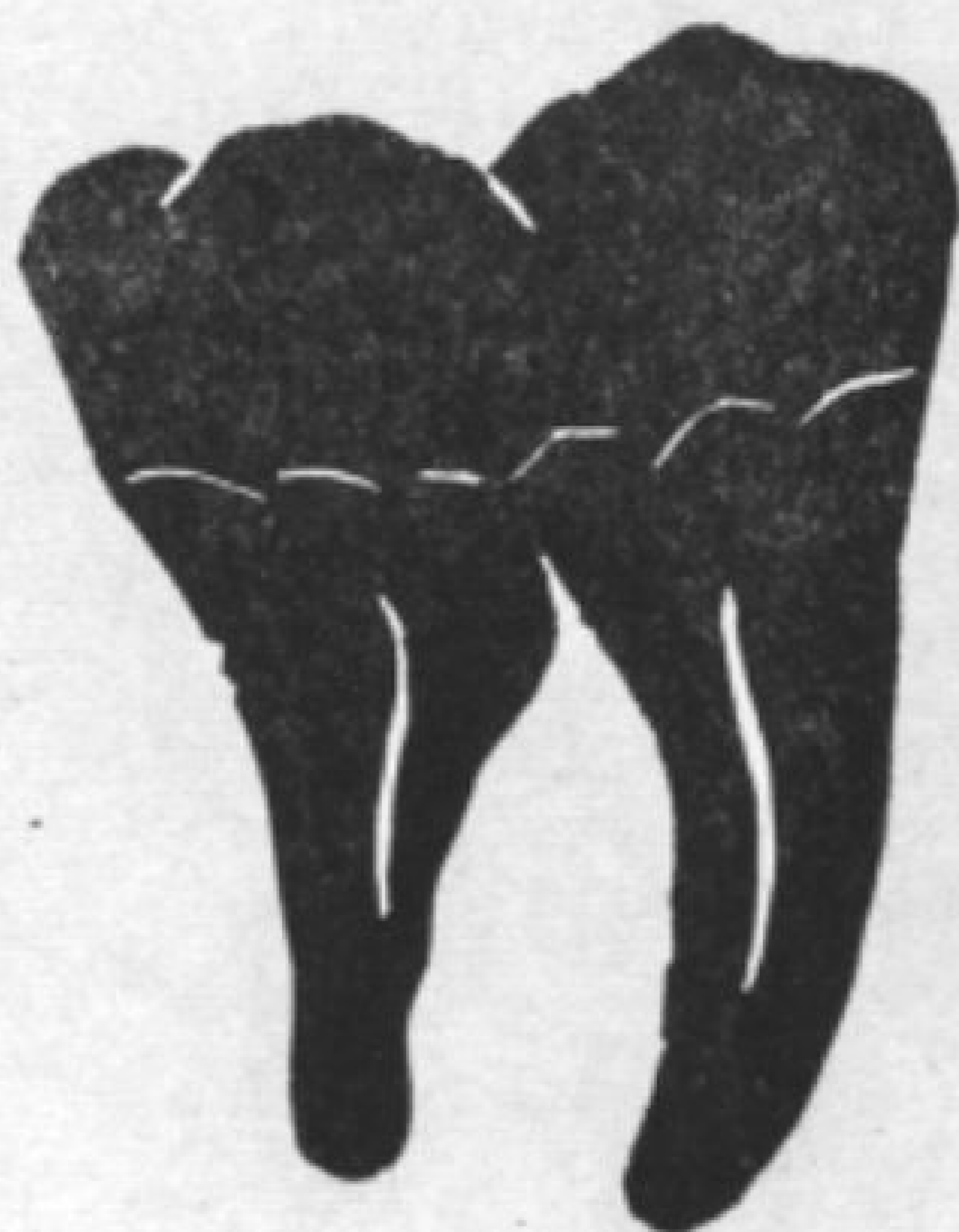

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EGES DENTISTS IN ARMY WASTED

Montreal, Oct 26 - Dr. D.P. Mowry, president of the Dental College of Oral Surgeons yesterday said, "It is about time that dentists in the army be permitted to return to private practice".

Addressing the opening session of a three day annual fall clinic of the Montreal Dental Clinic, Doctor Mowry said that although in the US dentists had been recommended to return to civilian life, Canada had so far "made no move in that direction."

"The war is rapidly drawing to a close", he said, "There should be enough operative dental work to keep the entire dental personnel busy".

"I feel it is about time that dentists in the army be permitted to return to private practice."

Mowry said there were trained dentists "Badly needed by the public and in our dental schools" - doing clerical work or executive work in the Dental Services.

"I don't see a dentist in the C.D.D. who can be spared and I fear there may be a shortage of personnel - should dentists be permitted to resign and return to civilian life", he said.

The above statement appeared in a Montreal Canadian Newspaper and comes from Dental Detachments for the Molar are welcomed.
